



Submissions by Country




countries with more than one PC member

Reviews

• Number of Reviews



- Reviewer's confidence
 - Each reviewer was asked to declare "estimated confidence" in advance;
 if necessary, an additional expert review was sought.
 - Every submission got at least one review with confidence ≥ 4

Rebuttal and PC discussion

- Rebuttal: soft limit of 800 words ("please try hard not to exceed 800 words")
- PC discussion ran from April 6 until April 18.
 - 475 comments
 - 55 reviews were modified after author response
- Accepted 28 regular papers.

Best Paper Awards by junior researchers and Special Issue

- Other authors should declare to the PC Chair that at least 50% of contribution is made by the junior researcher(s).
- Among 28 accepted papers, 14 were eligible.
- The winner:
 - Tom de Jong and Martin Escardo, "Predicative Aspects of Order Theory in Univalent Foundations".
