

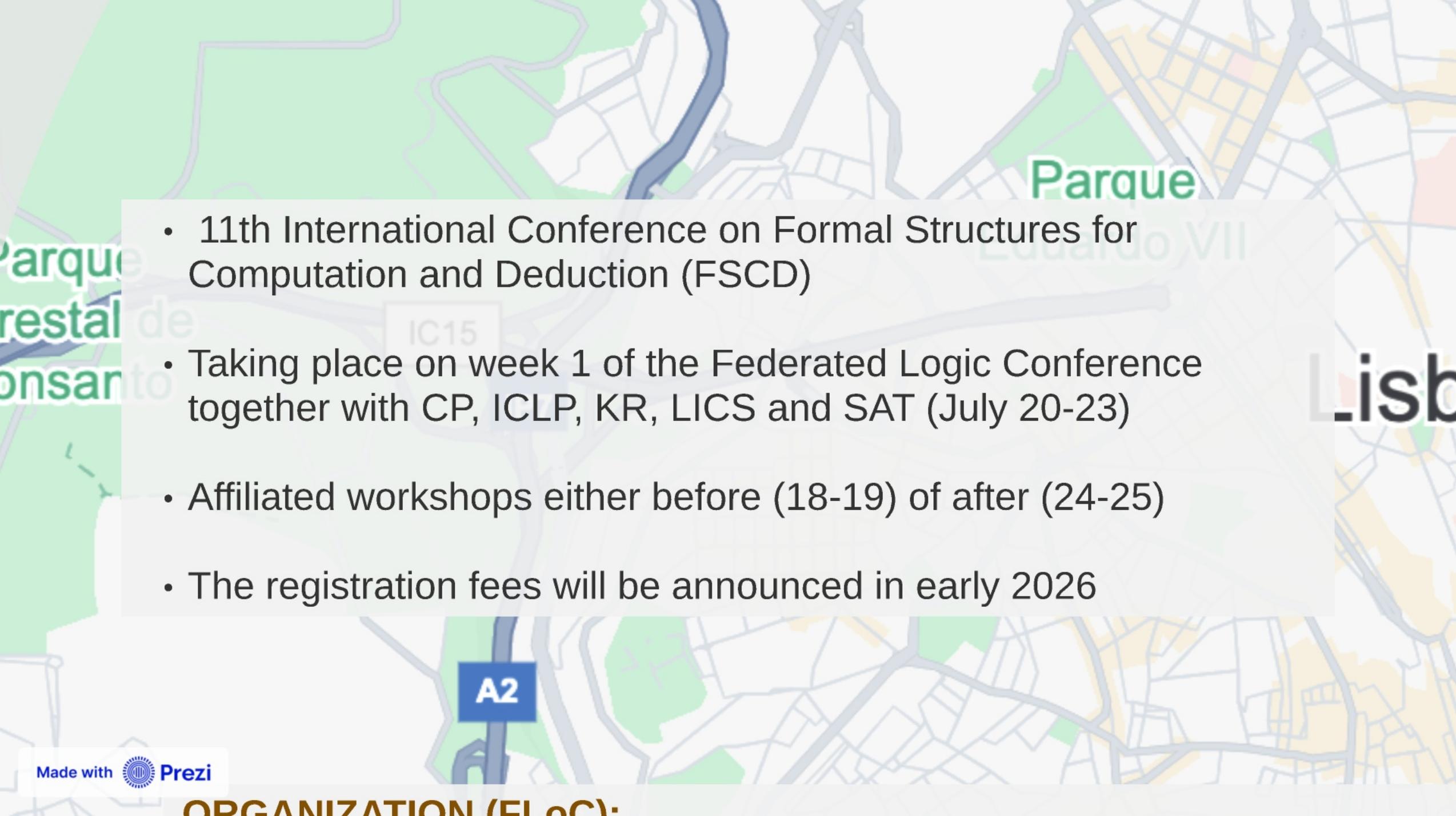

The Venue...



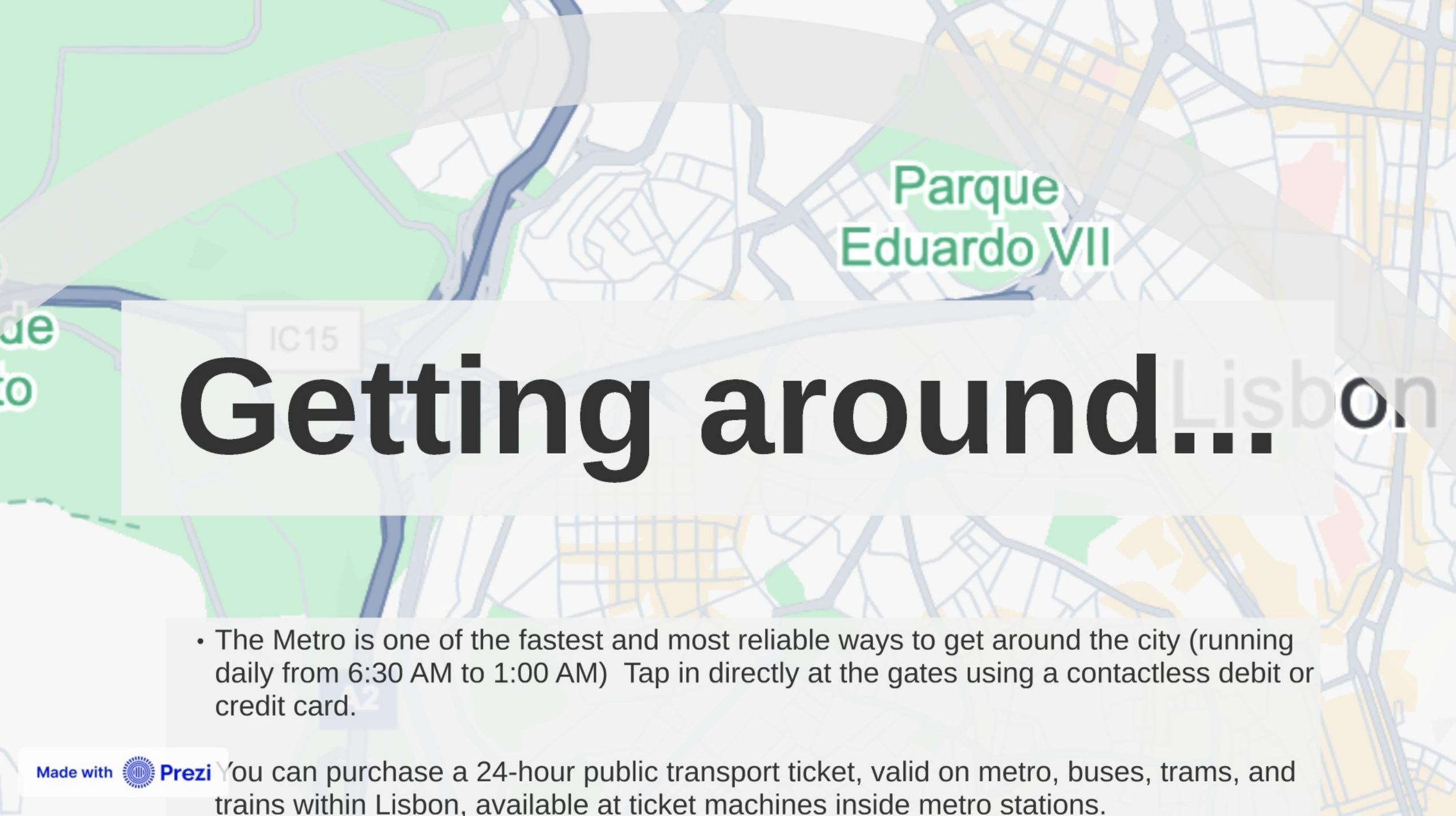
- All conferences and workshops will be held at ISCTE - Building II.
- Building II contains several lecture halls and rooms for workshops
- ISCTE campus is easily accessible by public transportation
- You can take the metro (yellow line) to “Cidade Universitária“ or one of several bus routes

Getting to Lisbon...

- Humberto Delgado Airport (LIS) is located inside the city and connected via metro (Red Line).

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- Additional flight options into Porto (OPO) or Faro (FAO), offering lower-cost international connections. From either city, you can travel to Lisbon by:
 - Train (CP) : ~3 hours from Porto, ~3.5 hours from Faro
 - Bus (Rede Expressos or Flixbus) : ~3–4 hours
- Train arrivals: Lisbon has two main train stations:
 - Oriente: well-connected via metro (Red Line) and close to the airport
 - Santa Apolónia: located closer to the historic city center (Blue Metro Line)
- Bus terminals:
 - Oriente: shared with the train station and metro (Red Line)
 - Sete Rios: accessible via metro (Blue Line, Jardim Zoológico station)

Getting around... Lisbon

- The Metro is one of the fastest and most reliable ways to get around the city (running daily from 6:30 AM to 1:00 AM) Tap in directly at the gates using a contactless debit or credit card.

Getting around...

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- You can purchase a 24-hour public transport ticket, valid on metro, buses, trams, and trains within Lisbon, available at ticket machines inside metro stations.
- You can also use the Navegante pre-paid travel card, working across the entire public transport system — including metro, buses, trams, ferries, and regional CP trains.

- Buses and historic trams in Lisbon are operated by Carris. On newer buses you can pay using a contactless debit or credit card. You can always use the Navegante pre-paid travel card.

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- Regional trains connect Lisbon with nearby cities like Sintra and Cascais. Use a Navegante pre-paid travel card or buy a ticket online at CP.pt or at a station.
- Taxis are widely available. Many accept cards, but ask first to be sure. Uber and Bolt are also available.
- You can use travel apps to navigate Lisbon's public transportation. Popular options include: Google Maps, Moovit, and Transit.

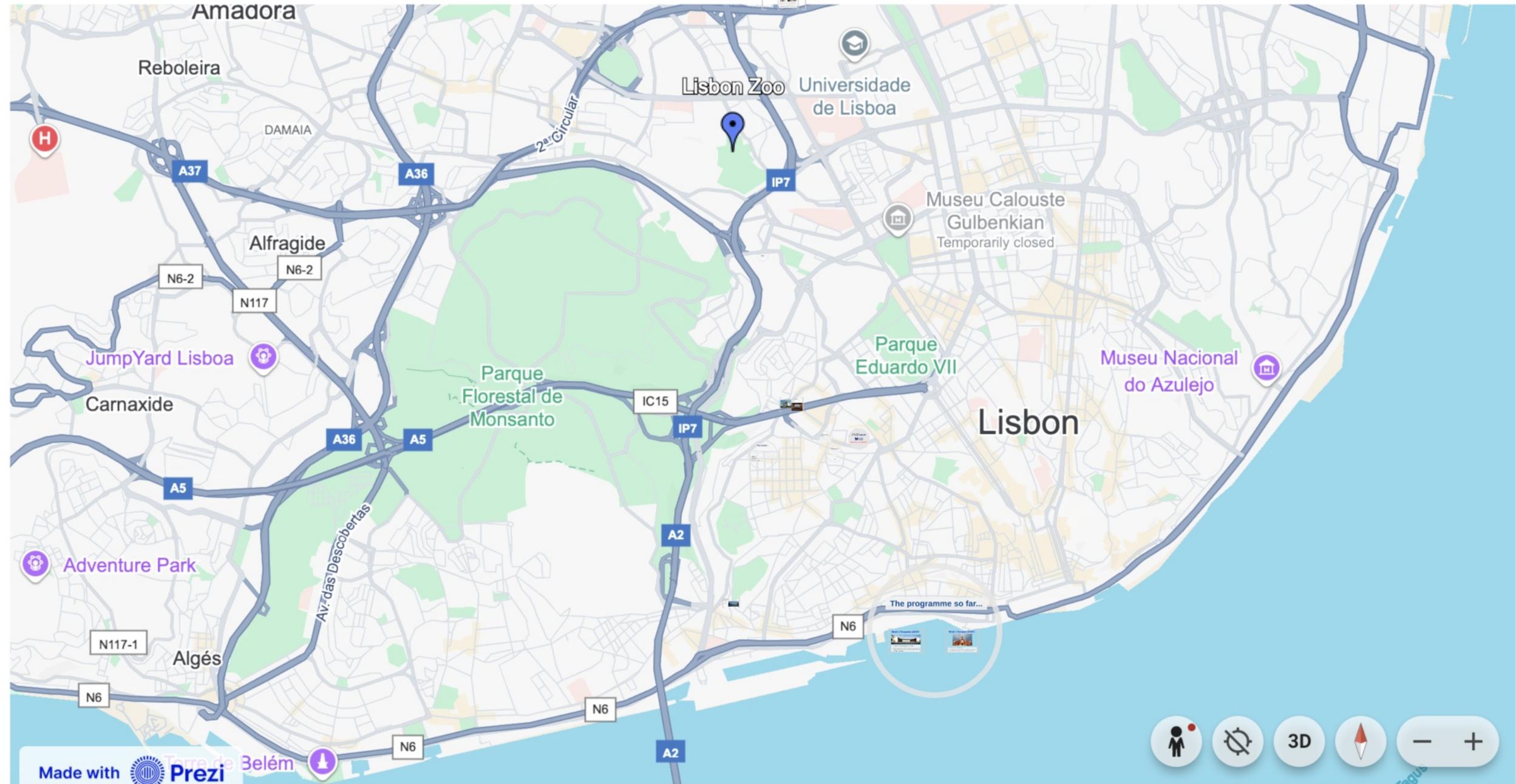
Week 1 Banquet (22/07)
